SENIORS TO PRESENT CLASS PLAY



The Bonduel High School Senior Class will present **ROOM FOR THE GROOM**, a three-act comedy, as the class play on April 26th and 27th. It is being produced by special arrangement with Row, Paterson, and Company, a firm noted for the quality of its plays.

The story centers around the middle income Allen Family, typical of many other families except that within a relatively short time they have many, many troubles. Tom Allen (Dale Dirks) and his wife Evelyn (Nancy Perz) are looking to the day when they can relax because their son Hal (Robert Zuehlsdorf) will be away at college and their daughter Leslie (Lenore Senzig) will be married to her not-too-successful fiancé, Bruce Hampden (Ronald Blom). It's a short-lived dream though, because in one day Hal, under the influence of a friend (Tom Westphal) who wants to buy a pool hall refuses his college acceptance; Bruce gets fired from his job; an old maid relative (Lynde Joy Jensen) decides to stay; their zany, fourteen year old daughter Angela (Judy Gehm) and her equally zany, fourteen year old friend (Bette Busch) bring a gang of boys and an orchestra into the house; and Tom is threatened with arrest by a city official (Toben Schlick) for building a workshop on city property.

When the wedding between Leslie and Bruce is called off everybody is thrown into a frenzy because Leslie can't seem to understand that a couple needs a little more in the way of material things to live. Love isn't enough. "Innocent" little Angela, in the meantime, mails the wedding invitations.

Tom and Evelyn's dream of peace and quiet has by now become a nightmare of chaos and headaches.

The play presents a wide variety of characters and personalities for interpretation--from steady Evelyn to scatterbrained Leslie and carefree Angela. It all adds up to much humor and fun.

A mass chorus was formed from students picked by their music teachers. The chorus practiced the numbers that they will give on May 12.

The music department was very busy during the weekend of April 7-8. On Sunday, April 8, they presented a music concert in the afternoon.

The Mixed Chorus opened the program with the song, "Hail, Glorious Song" and followed with "I Believe" and "Roadways." Next the quartet consisting of Bob Zuehlsdorf, Tom Westphal, Bob Barkhaus, and Dale Dirke sang "Brothers in Song."

The Girls' Glee sang two numbers, "I See God" and "Oh Vroneli."
