The Student Council, under the presidency of John Boelter, has 18 members representing the classes and different activities. They are:

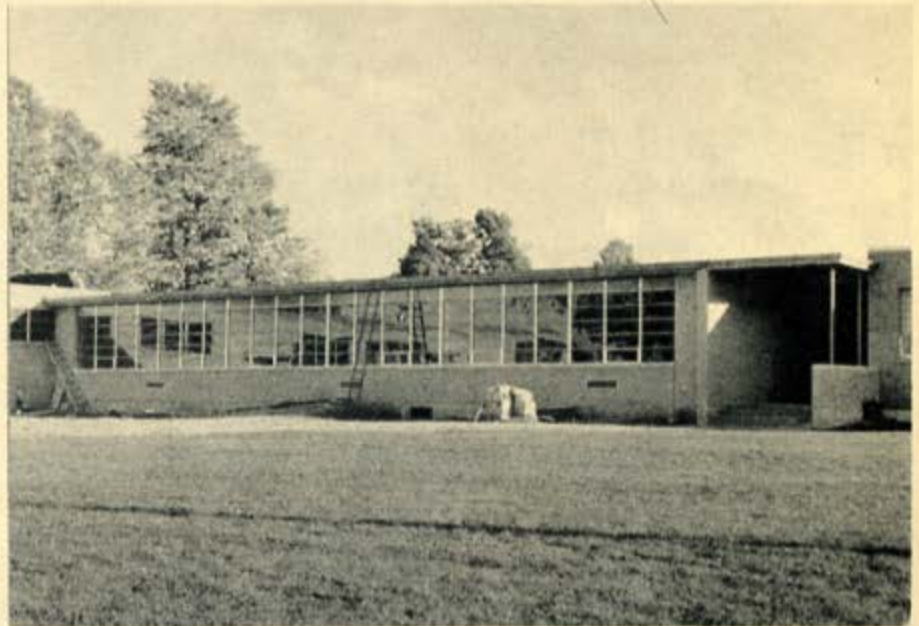

## OUR NEW SCHOOL

As you probably have noticed our new high school is well on its way to becoming a reality instead of just an illusion. Mr. Weix plans to have the non-science rooms furnished sometime in November, and most of the building should be completed by about January 1st.

However, the classes will not be moved from this building to the new until next year. A lot of planning has to be done in order to organize the classes properly because the 7th & 8th grades will remain in their present school. Next year we will have a Junior High within a Senior High.

The new addition to the present grade school will include seven additional class rooms, a teachers room and an office. Some rooms of special interest will be the chemistry and physics room, which will be complete with an experimental laboratory. A portion of the Home Ec. room will have a complete living room in outline form, with the floor having a planter design. Most of the rooms and class room floors will be indicative of the classes held in them.

A large letter "B" set in tile will be placed on the floor where the two buildings join. At the far end of the hall the numbers 59 will be imprinted in the tile signifying the year of completion. A new sign will emblazon the roof of the new structure. The white twenty four inch letter will declare to the countryside that this is Bonduel Community School

Next spring construction will start on the west end of the building. Included in this addition will be a beautiful gym, a small dairy bar, and a portion will be used as a recreation center.

# FOOTBALL SEASON GETS UNDERWAY



## BONDUEL BLANKS LUXEMBERG 13-0

The Bears overcame the mud and rain to defeat Luxemburg High 13-0. A heavy rain fell throughout the game and was a considerable handicap to both teams with the Bears losing the ball four times on fumbles and the Bluejays.

Lee Ebert galloped 35 yards off tackle for Bonduel's first touchdown in the first quarter, the first time the Bears had control of the ball. The try for the extra point was no good. In the second period, end Dave Herb recovered a fumble and ran to the Luxemburg 6 to set up the final score. Steve Nault passed to Herb for the touchdown and Nault converted.

Bonduel's rugged defensive line held the Luxers to only one first down during the tilt. stalwarts in the forward wall were Harvey Spreeman, Gary Vander Velden, Ken Capelle, John Nischke.

The closest Luxemburg got to Bonduel's line was when they recovered a fumble on the 25 and moved to the 14 before they were stopped.

Bonduel's was held to only seven first downs and completed one pass in two attempts, Nault's pass to Herb for a touchdown. The victory reversed a 13-0 loss to Luxemburg last year and was the first in several years over Luxemburg.

## Bonduel Tips Lena 7 to 0

The Bonduel Bears remained undefeated by defeating Lena 7 to 0. Although, the score doesn't sound very good Lena never posed a real threat. Bonduel remained a dangerous threat all through the game, shown by the fact that the Bears gained 203 yards and 11 first downs while Lena gained only 87 and had only 2 first downs. (one on a penalty). Bonduel's touchdown came after a sustained drive that wasn't stopped till Jerry Diemel smashed around left end for the touchdown. Steve "The Toe" Nault added the extra point easily, making the score 7-0 near the end of the fourth quarter.

The Bonduel defensive line, composed of Spreeman, Capelle, Kroening, Vander Velden, Vandenbrook, Vander-Heyden and Luepke showed superiority, determination and fair play. If the Bears continue with the drive and determination they had in the Lena game, no team in the Central Wisconsin Conference will be able to hold them down.

It was the Bonduel Bears Homecoming game last Friday night as the Bears met the Wittenberg Maroons in Bonduel Stadium. The Maroons were held scoreless by the inspired ball hankling of Coach Niles' favorite eleven.

In spite of the fact that Bonduels' rugged team was penalized 125 yards during the match Bonduel still seemed able to take advantage of the many breaks to which it owes its victory.

Scoring was opened early in the first period as half-back Allen Porter carried the pigskin into the Maroons end zone after the Bears gained the ball on a fumble by Wittenberg. Quarterback Nault then converted for the extra point which added to the touchdown making a total of seven points for Bonduel zero for Wittenberg.

After two periods in which neither team allowed the other to score Bonduel again rallied for another six points when halfback Corbett Harbor sped across the opposing teams goal line early in the fourth quarter. The sensational place kicking of Steve "the toe" Nault, as he successfully tried for his second conversion of the evening, brought Bonduel's total to 14 with Wittenberg still hoping. Tackle Harvey Spreeman then tallied two more points for the Bear's when he trapped a Marron ball-carrier in Wittenberg's own end zone for a safety.

Shortly afterward during the closing minutes of the game, the Wittenberg fans joyfully looked on as an explosive 80 yard run, touched off by a screen pass

gave the Maroons their first and only touchdown of the contest. But their joy was short lived as the play was nullified by a clipping penalty. Even so, this demonstration of superb blocking and excellent footwork was to remain one of the highlights of Bonduel's homecoming game.

This was the first conference game the both teams this season. Wittenberg suffered their first loss of the season as the final score was the Bear 16 and Wittenberg 0. Bonduel's record for the season now stands at three wins, no losses, and one tie while Wittenberg has one win, one loss, and one tie for the season.
