Our homecoming started out at three o'clock Friday afternoon with everyone attending one of the largest parades we've ever had in Bonduel on homecoming day. The parade featured the band lead by six cheerleaders, two queen's cars, and eight float representing the classes and various's organizations. The prize winning floats were Jr. class, first; Sophomore class second; Senior class, third; and Photography club, honorable mention.

The activities were resumed at eight o'clock on the football field. Where our Golden Bears defeated Waupaca 19-7.

Beginning at 10 p.m. in the gymnasium, was the annual Homecoming dance. At 10:45 queen Donna Aderhold received a crown from King Dick Rudie. The gym was decorated to represent a football field. The back wall consisting of 3 life size football players in action, on a yardlined imitation field. The ceiling consisted of the yardlines, marked off with white crepe paper and the yard number on each side of each line. In between the yardlines were strings of balloons. At the back wall and at the back of the stage were two sets of actual goal posts. The orchestra furnishing the music was Carl Knoppe.

In the statistical end of the game, the Bears outplayed the Indians 3-1, but were unable to come through in the clutch.

WITTENBERG OVER BONDUEL 12-7

Wittenberg jumped off to an early lead Friday night by recovering two Bonduel fumbles for two touchdowns. Trailing 12-0 at the end of the first period of Wittenberg's homecoming game the Bears climaxed a drive from their own 20 with a 48 yard touchdown run by half back Dick Rudie early in the second period. Quarterback Steve "the toe" Nault booted the final point of the game. Twice during the second half Bonduel crossed the Wittenberg goal, the first time the referee called the ball dead on the one-half yard line while the next attempt, a 38 yard run by halfback Jerry Diemel was nullified by a holding penalty. This second straight conference loss gives the Bears a 0-2 conference record and a 3-2 record for the season.
